#### CFSD Star Award

The governing board recognized the Catalina Foothills High School (CFHS) National Merit® Scholarship Program Semifinalists and Commended Students. The National Merit® Scholarship Program is an annual academic competition among high school students for recognition and college undergraduate scholarships that began in 1955. The 2025 semifinalists are Joseph Drexler, Fox Foster, Sara Christina Nielsen, Nilay Patel, Carson Ruiz, Tahlia Szoke, and Bryan Zhang. Board Member Gina Mehmert and Catalina Foothills High School Principal Chris Lambert highlighted the students' remarkable journeys and the challenges each have faced to achieve this elite recognition. Each commended scholar and semifinalist were presented with a certificate and pin.

# <u>Deep Learning Showcase - History Under Investigation:</u> Fifth Graders Crack the Case of the Boston Massacre

The governing board viewed a presentation featuring an engaging fifth-grade Interdisciplinary Studies (IDS) project at Canyon View Elementary School led by teacher Samantha Thompson, who transformed a lesson on the Boston Massacre into a dynamic Crime Scene Investigation experience. Parents took on the roles of witnesses to the historic event, allowing students to interview them for firsthand accounts. Immersed in their roles as detectives or reporters, students analyzed documents and "evidence" from the scene, piecing together details about how the Boston Massacre occurred. Detectives compiled their findings into crime scene files, while reporters crafted newspaper articles to capture the event's significance. The project culminated in student presentations to small groups, who offered constructive feedback, enhancing both their understanding of history and their communication skills.

Catalina Foothills School District Named Arizona's Only All-A K-12 District Catalina Foothills School District (CFSD) proudly stands as Arizona's only K-12 district to have every school earn an "A" rating from the Arizona Department of Education (ADE) for the 2023-2024 school year. This exceptional milestone reflects CFSD's commitment to excellence, rigorous academic standards, and the collective effort of its students, teachers, families, and community.

Additionally, CFSD is thrilled to announce that Sunrise Drive Elementary School achieved a perfect score of 100 in the total points earned in the Arizona Accountability Model. This achievement makes Sunrise Drive Elementary the only K-8 public school among Arizona's 1,368 K-8 schools to earn this distinction, underscoring the school's unwavering dedication to academic excellence and student growth.

The ADE's A-F Letter Grade system annually evaluates schools on critical performance metrics, including student growth in English language arts, math, and science; proficiency and growth of English language learners; high school graduation rates; and readiness indicators for college or careers. CFSD's achievement reflects a district-wide dedication to preparing students for success in college and beyond.

#### National Merit Semifinalists

We are proud to announce that seven of our seniors have been named National Merit Semifinalists in the 2025 National Merit® Scholarship Program. In an average year, less than 1% of U.S. high school seniors are named National Merit Semifinalists. By comparison, an impressive 1.4% of CFHS seniors earned this prestigious distinction.

Congratulations to our Class of 2025 Semifinalists Joseph Drexler, Fox Foster, Sara Christina Nielsen, Nilay Patel, Carson Ruiz, Tahlia Szoke, and Bryan Zhang. These students now have the opportunity to compete for nearly 7,000 National Merit Scholarships worth a total of \$26 million, to be awarded in the spring of 2025. To advance in the competition, our Semifinalists must fulfill several additional requirements to achieve Finalist standing. We are incredibly proud of them and wish them continued success as they move forward in this competition.

#### **CFHS Girls Golf**

The CFHS girls' golf team, coached by Robert Rathbun, qualified and competed in the Arizona Interscholastic Association (AIA) Division II State Championship! The state

championship took place at Aguila Golf Club in Phoenix on Monday, October 28th and Tuesday, October 29th. The team proudly finished in seventh place at the state championships, achieving a total score of 683. The girls had a remarkable season, coming within just one stroke of an undefeated match record. They recently secured a victory over their top Southern Arizona rivals, Salpointe Catholic and Ironwood Ridge, in a thrilling match. ## <u>Esperero Canyon Middle School Sixth Grader Recognized</u> in Arizona Treasurer's Essay Contest

The Catalina Foothills School District is proud to announce that Abby Henson, a sixth grader from Esperero Canyon Middle School, has been selected as one of the 20 winners of Arizona Treasurer Kimberly Yee's annual AZ529 Essay Writing Contest. Abby's winning essay was chosen from among 627 entries submitted by fifth and sixth grade students from across Arizona's 15 counties, representing district, charter, private schools, Bureau of Indian Education, and homeschools.

#### <u>Preliminary Approval of the 2026-2027 School Year</u> <u>Calendar (second reading)</u>

Associate Superintendent Mindy Westover presented no additional changes to the 2026-2027 school year calendar since the governing board's review on October 22. Highlights of the calendar include: new teachers' reporting date of July 29; returning teachers' reporting date of August 4; the first day of school August 10; Fall Break October 12–16 (full week); K-12 parent teacher conferences October 27, 28, 29; PreK parent-teacher conferences September 28–October 9 and April 19–30 by appointment only; Winter Break includes three weekends; semesters are unevenly divided (85/95 days); last day of school on May 26; and last contract day for teachers is

May 27. The governing board tabled the item for additional review by administration to consider options to balance the number of days in each semester. The 2026-2027 school year calendar will return to the agenda for a third reading at the next regular governing board meeting on November 25.

# Consideration of Revisions to Policy and Regulation DJE, DJE-R, Bidding / Purchasing Procedures (first reading)

Superintendent Bartlett presented revisions to the policy and regulation related to bidding / purchasing procedures to ensure that grant-related purchases are not made from an entity that has been suspended or debarred by the federal government. Suspension and debarment are actions taken by the federal government against organizations or individuals who have committed fraud or a criminal offense in violation of federal law. The policy and regulation have been revised to include language to check for procurement contracts for goods and services awarded under a non-procurement transaction (e.g., grant or cooperative agreement) that are expected to equal or exceed \$25,000, for debarment or suspension of any agency, entity, and its principals. The policy and regulation will return to the agenda for a second reading on November 25.

#### Study Session: Understanding A-F Accountability System

Coordinator of Student Data, Assessment, and Accountability Justin Robinson provided an in-depth study of the A-F Letter Grade Accountability System, including major details regarding how points for specific indicators are calculated in the categories of proficiency, growth, English learners, acceleration/ readiness, graduation, and college/career readiness.

Detailed information about the <u>A-F Letter Grades Indicator Breakdown</u> was made available to the CFSD community as part of the governing board meeting agenda item 2.1 on the CFSD website.
